Principal's Message

Welcome to Monterey Trail High School (MTHS), home of the Mustangs! Our Student Support Team (SST) is driven by our school's mission to create a learning community that challenges all students to realize their greatest potential while preparing them for their future. The SST understands its role in supporting all students in achieving academic success and becoming career and college ready. The SST recognizes its role in supporting student safety and a positive school climate in order to encourage college and career readiness success. The SST is involved in school programs including the following: presenting college and career lessons, hosting college presentations, facilitating college application workshops, assisting in financial aid information nights, and supporting our Positive Behavior Interventions (PBIS) program. The Support Personnel Accountability Report Card (SPARC) supports the goals outlined in our School Site Improvement Plan, as such, the SST is dedicated to working on the following focus-for-improvement goals: 1) increase the number of students who complete all of the University of California A-G subject area courses and 2) increase the number of students who develop post-high school plans.

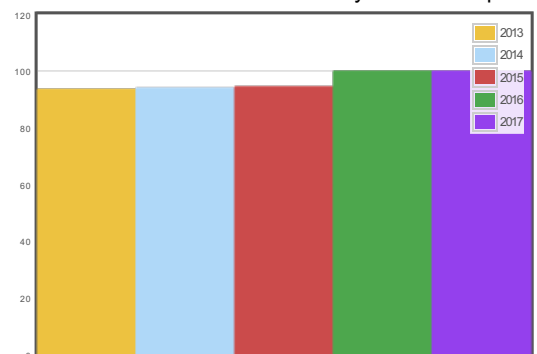
Career and College Readiness Student Outcomes

The SST believes that it is essential to focus on student outcomes to identify areas for improvement and develop support services. Moreover, qualitative and quantitative student outcomes are used to evaluate the effectiveness of our program's support services in the two SPARC Outcome Categories: Career Readiness and College Readiness. The graphs below demonstrate outcomes achieved through the efforts, support, and activities of the SST.

Career Readiness

MTHS Counselors and Career Center Staff collaborate to help students develop post-secondary plans. Career Center Staff presents career guidance lessons to assist students in identifying their values, skills, and interests and in exploring post-high school options. During academic advising, counselors work with students to develop four-year plans that reflect students' career goals and interests. The chart to the right illustrates the percentages of MTHS seniors who developed a post-high school plan: 93.6% (470) in 2013, 94.0% (470) in 2014, 94.5% (429) in 2015, 100.0% (467) in 2016, and 100% 524 in 2017.

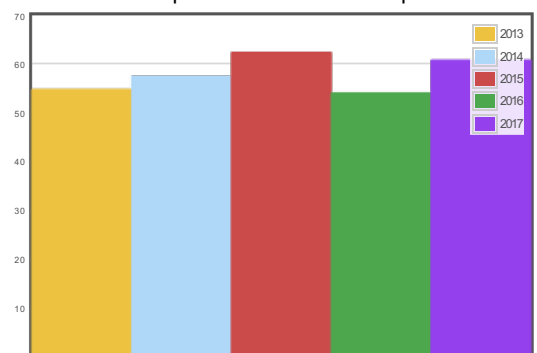
Career Action Plan/Postsecondary Plan Developed



College Readiness

MTHS Counselors and Career Center Staff guide students through the A-G courses that are required for admission to the University of California and the California State University systems. Through career guidance lessons, students make plans for completing graduation requirements as well meeting the A-G requirements. During academic advising, counselors work with students to review transcripts, A-G requirements, and credit or grade improvement options. The chart shows the percentages of MTHS graduating seniors who met the A-G requirements: 54.8% (269) in 2013, 57.5% (258) in 2014, 62.4% (307) in 2015, 54.1% (276) in 2016, and 60.8% (304) in 2017.

21st Century Skills

The SST believes that it is essential that all students have a strong foundation in 21st Century Skills; and therefore, SST members have embedded skill acquisition, development, and practice in our program. Members of the SST present career guidance lessons to 100% of students. In these lessons, students create education plans, refine their online student career portfolios, and prepare for their senior presentations. Another avenue where the SST encourages development of 21st Century Skills is through our Link Crew Program. Link Crew student leaders mentor freshmen with their transition from middle school to high school. Link Crew Leaders help with the organization of activities that encourage the development of a connection between students to high school. SST members assist with recommendations for future Link Leaders.

Additional Achievements:

- The FAFSA submission rate for the class of 2017 was 75.2% compared to 67.4% for the district.
- The Cal Grant award rate for the class of 2017 was 48.6% compared to 35.0% for the district.
- The graduation rate for the class of 2017 was 95.67% compared to 83.77% for the state.
